Woods Charter School offers a challenging academic program that equips students with a strong foundation and fosters a passion for learning.

Students pursue tailored academic plans that build a broad base of knowledge and allow for inquiry, interests, and opportunities. Individualized academic counseling takes place within the teacher-student advisory model as students plan their academic progress to meet their personal goals. Senior advisors work with small cohorts to guide the college process, with a focus on finding a "good fit" for each student.

High school enrollment is 186. Class sizes range from 8-24, promoting student engagement and leadership. Enrollment is capped at 46 students per grade level, the size of each graduating class. We do not rank students.

The year-long calendar provides six 52-minute periods per day. Upon meeting graduation requirements, students may pursue advanced work through North Carolina School of Science and Math, local community colleges, or self-designed independent study. Students act as peer tutors and mentors to younger students in the K12 setting.

Woods Charter students are encouraged to engage in their studies, their communities, and in the larger world with curiosity, compassion, and critical thought.

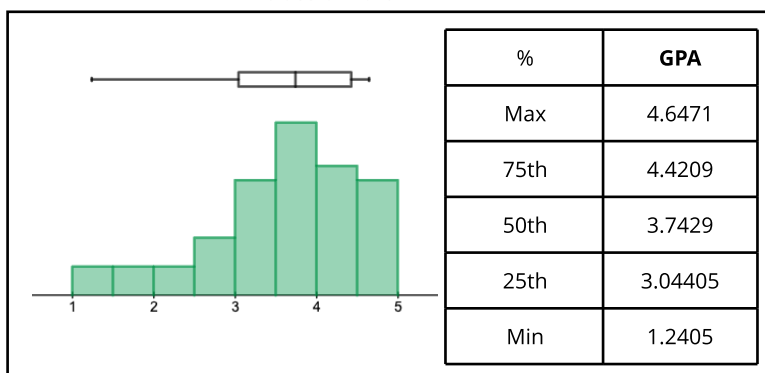
